FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Bishops sound the Alarm

I trust that we all took the time to read the pastoral letter issued by some one hundred & fifty-four Bishops of the Episcopal Church (both serving as well as retired). It is unusual for our bishops to weigh in on social/political issues of the day, for our prelates pride themselves in being apolitical. However recent events in Minnesota in particular, and for that matter across the nation, have forced our Bishops to give voice to what afflicts us as a nation. They could not remain silent in the face of the unthinkable happening in broad daylight! Yes, citizens murdered, young children arrested, and taken into custody, while others have been separated from their parents! Of course other outrages have stunned us all into silence, with some quietly asking, is this still America? Rather than call for prayers as we often do as a church, our Bishops have instead urged all of us to protest in some measure, for silence is not an option in the face of injustice, oppression and open discrimination. Regardless of our political persuasions, we Episcopalians have no choice but to follow the dictates of the gospel mandate, to love and care for the stranger in our midst and the marginalized.

Let us pray that change will come soon before there is any further escalation of what we are currently experiencing almost daily.
